*"Ladies and gentlemen, the Captain has turned on the Fasten Seat Belt sign. And also make sure your seat back and folding trays are in their full upright position."*

Most of us have heard those words many times as we settle into our seats and prepare for take-off. For those who love to fly those words are little more than white noise, but for those who are terrified of flying those words ratchet up the anxiety. Ministry is a lot like air travel especially when a new pastor is called. Some are excited. Some are indifferent. Some are scared. Does this pilot know what he's doing? Will the plane get off the ground? Will it be a smooth flight or a bumpy one? Will we crash?

I understand all those emotions. Transition is always a time of uncertainty. I am overwhelmingly excited to be here and still transition brings a degree of anxiety. I am excited to work with our talented staff and I'm already seeing the many gifts that Immanuel is blessed with. I believe we can and will do amazing things together. If I didn't I wouldn't be here, but that doesn't mean our entire flight will be smooth. In fact, I don't think it should be. I believe ministry should be challenging because the gospel itself is challenging. I believe our faith is strengthened most when we challenge it. Theologian Eugene Peterson wrote, "Being a pastor who satisfies congregations is one of the easiest jobs in the world, IF we are content to satisfy congregations." I love that quote because it's a reminder that we can't be

complacent in our ministry, just because it is easy. Think of your faith as a muscle. How do muscles grow and remain strong? Through exercise our muscles are put to work and challenged. In order to strengthen our faith, we must exercise our faith muscles by challenging them.

So, what does that mean as we begin our journey together? It means we won't take the easy way out. We will do our best to live into the gospel even when it challenges us. It means we will undoubtedly have some bumps along the way. Every flight does. But we will fly through them together and we will love each other along the way.

Based on what you've read so far, you might be fearful or expecting things to change rapidly. You shouldn't. Yes, Immanuel has seen a 29% decline in worship attendance since 2011 but we have an abundance of resources. We don't have a ministry that needs to be knocked down and rebuilt. The ministry here is vibrant but common sense tells you that if nothing changes the trend won't change either. Many times, a new pastor is viewed as the answer to reversing that trend. While I hope

This gathering of all ages, skill levels, and church sizes gives the musicians attending learning opportunities and inspiration that makes aware new and fresh ideas of music for their individual churches. The amount of information and literature takes months to disseminate. It's just plain thrilling. You walk the halls and see walking the Who's who in the organ world, Fred Swan, past organist of the Hour of Power, Vincent Dubois one of three of the organists at Notre Dame, Paris, Chelsea Chen organist at Coral Ridge Presbyterian and the list goes on. It's inspiring to be able to talk to these gifted artists because they are so accessible at this gathering.

Later in August there is a local gathering of the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians in Vero Beach where for a day we get to meet other church musicians in our tradition and learn and share ideas.

We are fortunate that our church at Immanuel recognizes the importance of these gatherings and I have the opportunity to attend. I am overwhelmed with gratitude and will bring that knowledge and renewed inspiration back to our church. ■

The soup kitchen has long been one of Immanuel's best outreach services for the poor and homeless in our community. With the loss of Christ Fellowship on the third Sunday of the month, that has now become Immanuel's weekend to staff with volunteers.

Work crews are needed to help with food preparation, sandwich and salad help, and the inevitable clean-up. Each work party is about two hours time, more on the food preparation and clean-up than on the sandwich and salad help. We need 3-4 people to cook, 2 people to make sandwiches and salads, and 3-4 for clean-up. We have to be out by 6:00 PM to make way for the Guatemalans Church Service which starts soon afterwards. People start arriving about 4:00 to socialize and begin their salads, with food being served about 4:15-4:30. Everyone has to leave by 5:30. Based on this past Sunday we really could use some more help with clean-up and a bit more help with food preparation.

I personally find it very rewarding to serve in the capacity of coordinator and to fill in where necessary as




